# Animals and their Habitats

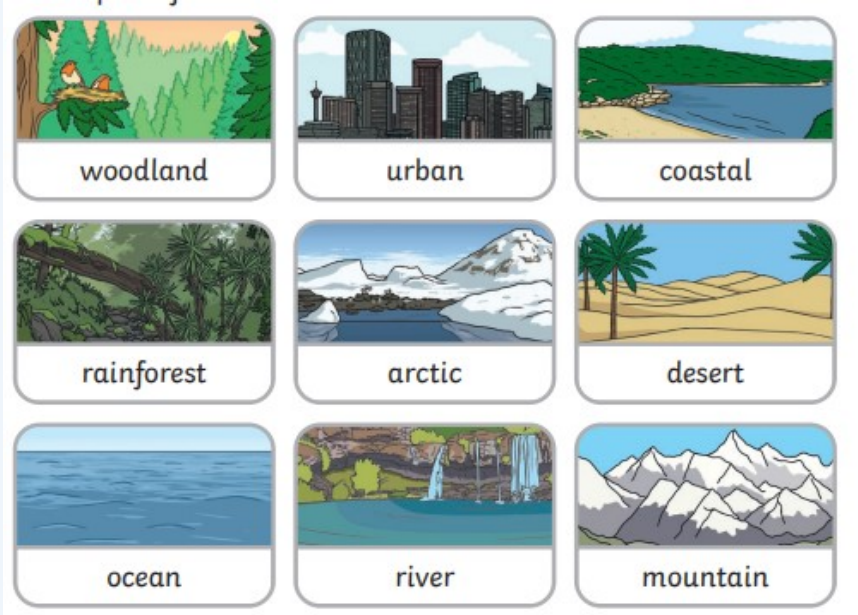

### Tier 3 vocabulary

<b>Habitat</b>	A home environment for plants, animals and other living things.
<b>Microhabitat</b>	Small, specific home environments e.g. individual trees, a pond, under a rock or a pile of logs.
<b>Food chain</b>	A diagram that shows us how animals are linked by what they eat.
<b>Consumer</b>	A living thing that eats plants or other animals.
<b>Producer</b>	Living things that make their own food, such as plants.
<b>Inhabitant</b>	A person or animal that lives in a place.
<b>Environment</b>	Everything around us.
<b>Predator</b>	An animal that lives mostly by killing and eating other animals.
<b>Prey</b>	An animal that is hunted or killed by another animal for food.

### Tier 2 vocabulary

<b>Living thing</b>	Living things are things that are alive. People, animals and plants are living things. Living things need a few things to stay alive. These essential things are air, water, and food. Both animals and plants need water.
<b>Dead</b>	A living thing that is no longer alive.
<b>Non-living</b>	Things that are not alive and have never been alive.
<b>Suitability</b>	The fact of being acceptable or right for something or someone.
<b>Classify</b>	To arrange in groups, by some property. E.g. these shapes are classified by the number of sides.
